Statewide Survey Asks Pathways Members for Information about Campus Programs and Services: Deadline November 6, 2019



The Positive Pathways team has sent out a survey to gain greater insight into the programs and services available to former foster youth at public colleges and universities throughout Florida.

The survey, which can be completed on a smart phone, a tablet or using a computer, asks about how foster care liaisons identify and reach out to students using the exemption, and if they offer services and resources specific to these students.

"Each year the number of students from foster care enrolled in Florida colleges and universities increases at a faster rate than other subpopulations of students,"

said Dr. Amy Rubinson, who helped design the survey for Educate Tomorrow, which administers the Positive Pathways Program. "We are interested in knowing how these students are being served so that we can share this information with the entire Pathways network as well as policy makers in Florida and even in other states."
